

What is an "X", "T"

or "F" Bus?

These letters either after or before the route number tell you that this bus has limited stops and pick ups, these letters are used on all timetables and on the destination sign on the front of the bus.

"X"

After a route number, indicates the bus travels along the same route but does not stop or pick up people at every stop. It means it is an express service to get people over long distances as quickly as possible.



"T"

Before the route number means it is a Transit link bus designed to get people to the City with the minimum amount of stops during peak times.



"F"

Over part of its route, depending on whether the bus is travelling to or from the city, the bus will not pick up or set down passengers. This allows express service for some passengers on long bus trips. This change occurs at a designated stop along the route shown on all relevant timetables.
