



Types of Metrotickets

How long is my Metroticket valid for?

- Multitrip and Singletrip Zone tickets are valid for 2 hours from the time of validation. You can transfer services as many times as you need within these two hours.
- Multitrip and Singletrip 2 Section tickets are only valid for one short journey and are not transferable to another service.

Please Note: A section is a small part of a route. It covers around 3 kms and is shown on all route maps by small triangles. It usually covers up to 4 bus stops.

Where can I buy a Metroticket?

Multitrip tickets

Available from the InfoCentre, staffed railway stations, bus depots and over 700 convenience stores, newsagents and selected post office agencies displaying the Metroticket signage. **Multitrip tickets are not available on-board vehicles.**

Singletrip and Daytrip tickets

Available from the InfoCentre, staffed railway stations, bus depots, and over 700 convenience stores, newsagents and selected post office agencies displaying the Metroticket signage plus on-board buses and trams and from Ticket Vending Machines on trains.

2 Section Singletrip tickets are not available from Ticket Vending Machines on trains.

- The ticket vending machines on trains only accepts \$2, \$1, 50^c, 20^c, and 10^c, coins, but not 5^c coins or notes.



METROTICKET TYPES



All Times Multitrip ticket (red)

Red Multitrip tickets are valid at ALL TIMES and contain 10 trips.



Interpeak Multitrip ticket (charcoal)

Charcoal Interpeak Multitrip tickets are valid between the hours of 9.01am and 3.00pm Monday to Friday excluding public holidays and contain 10 trips.



All Times Singletrip ticket (blue)

Blue Singletrip tickets are valid at ALL TIMES and contain one trip.



Interpeak Singletrip ticket (blue)

Blue Interpeak Singletrip tickets are valid between the hours of 9.01am and 3.00pm Monday to Friday excluding public holidays and contain one trip.



Daytrip ticket (blue)

A Daytrip ticket allows unlimited travel and transfers for one day from validation until 4.30am the following day. On weekends and public holidays, two children aged 5 to under 15 years old can travel FREE when accompanied by an adult using a Daytrip ticket.



Seniors Card Holder - free ticket (green)

All Seniors Card holders travel free on Adelaide Metro services between 9.01 am and 3 pm weekdays, and all day weekends and public holidays.

Many of these Metrotickets are available offering different levels of concession. If you pay a Concession Holder fare it is essential that you travel with a South Australian Government approved concession card. If you don't, you may be fined.



Stamping (validating) your Metroticket

- When you get on the bus you will notice a blue box called a stamping (validating) machine just to the right.



- This is where you insert the Metroticket that you have bought from the driver or pre purchased from one of our many Metroticket retailers.

- Insert the Metroticket into the stamping (validating) machine face up and with the arrows pointing forward.



- The Metroticket will then be stamped (validated).
- You must stamp (validate) your Metroticket each time you board a service, even if you are transferring from one service to another.
